



## Transfer Guide for CONCORDIA UNIVERSITY, ST. PAUL and CENTURY COLLEGE

The complete Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) and Liberal Arts Associate of Arts (AA) degrees are fully accepted general education requirements with the addition of two religion courses at Concordia. Also, individually completed goal areas completed within the MnTC will transfer toward individual general education requirements at Concordia University St. Paul.

### What are the admission requirements?

- Minimum 2.00 cumulative grade point average
- Letter of recommendation from the dean of students of the college or university you last attended
- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities you have attended

### Does Concordia accept the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum?

Yes! Transfer students who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum or an Associate of Arts degree from an accredited institution are considered to have met Concordia's general education requirements with the exception of two religion classes (8 credits.) Concordia University also accepts *individual goal areas* completed within the MnTC.

### Will I need to submit high school transcripts or ACT scores?

Transfer students with 20+ college-level semester credits completed after high school are not required to submit high school transcripts or ACT scores.

### What are the most popular areas of study at Concordia University?

Concordia's most popular areas of study in our traditional programs are business, education, communication, church work, psychology, theater, and science majors. Concordia also offers a variety of educational options for adults looking to complete BA degrees in an accelerated evening or online format. These programs can take as little as 16–22 months to complete; attending class one night per week. More information on this style of program can be found here:

### What merit scholarships and grants are available?

Transfer students are automatically awarded one of four scholarships (renewable for two additional years) based on cumulative GPA at the time of admission. A transfer student who receives one of these awards must also attend full-time in undergraduate day classes and have completed a minimum of 20 semester credits prior to entering Concordia University. The award amounts for academic year 2012-2013 are:

TRANSFER CURRICULUM MAP FOR GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES**

The following courses at **Century College** are recommended as general education requirements for an efficient transfer process into **Concordia University, St. Paul**. This transfer guide applies to students who intend to enter one of Concordia's traditional daytime on campus programs. Aside from this guide, the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and Liberal Arts Associate of Arts degrees are fully accepted as completion of general education requirements with the addition of two Concordia religion courses.

Concordia University maps the MNSCU Transfer Curriculum as noted below. Note: if a student **completes** a MNSCU goal area they meet the related General Education requirement of Concordia University indicated in the left column below.

If a student does not complete the MNSCU Goal area they will need to complete specific courses as noted below. In general a student should choose a course in the Goal Area that is in the same discipline as Concordia's equivalent course. If needed, students can reach a counselor at Concordia to help with this process by calling 651-641-8230.
