

**Century Community College**  
**Transfer Guide for**  
**METROPOLITAN STATE UNIVERSITY**  
**General Education**

Metropolitan State University is one of the seven Minnesota State Universities. It is a comprehensive urban university committed to meeting the higher education needs of the Twin Cities and greater metropolitan population; we have three campuses, St. Paul, Midway, and Minneapolis.

**TRANSFER PROCESS:**

1. Apply to Metropolitan State University at [www.metrostate.edu](http://www.metrostate.edu).
2. Pay \$20 non-refundable application fee.
3. Request official transcripts of all post-secondary college or university attended.
4. Once application file is complete, student will be notified within 30 days, follow by orientation and registration information, where student will register for courses.
5. Student will receive a Degree Audit Report (DARS) showing how courses will transfer.  
NOTE: All Minnesota Transfer Curriculum courses will transfer and up to 16 semester technical courses will transfer up front. If entering a program that has an *articulation agreement*, transcripts will be re-evaluated for more credits once admission to major is confirmed.

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT or TRANSFER AGREEMENTS:**

**ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:**

Transfer Student is someone who has completed a minimum of 16 college-level semester credits (24 quarter credits) from an accredited college

- If all of the student's postsecondary cumulative GPA averages out to be at least 2.0 then he/she will be accepted.

NOTE: Some majors may require higher GPA.

Freshmen is someone who completed 15 or less college-level semester credits (24 quarter credits) from an accredited college

- If a student's high school transcript shows that he/she is ranked top 50% of his/her high school class, he/she will be admitted.
- Or if a student's ACT composite is 21; he/she will be admitted.

**Application Deadline date:**

June 15           for Fall Semester  
November 15   for Spring Semester  
March 15         for Summer Semester

<p><b>Goal 4: Mathematical/Logical Reasoning</b>            Choose one course from Century's goal 4 that is at least 3 credits.</p>	<p><b>Goal IV: Mathematical/Logical Reasoning</b>—At least one course (<a href="#">See GELS course list</a>- 3 or more credits).  <i>Note: This requirement is waived for students placing above the college algebra level on the university's higher level math assessment.</i></p>
<p><b>Goal 5: History, Social Sciences, and Behavioral Sciences</b>            Choose two courses from Century's goal 5 list. Make sure these two courses are from two different disciplines (subjects) and add up to 6 credits.</p>	<p><b>Goal V: History and the Social and Behavioral Sciences</b>—At least two courses from two different disciplines (6 or more credits).</p>
<p><b>Goal 6: Humanities and Fine Arts</b>            Choose two courses from Century's goal 6 list. Make sure these two courses are from two different disciplines (subjects) and add up to 6 credits.</p>	<p><b>Goal VI: Humanities and the Fine Arts</b>—At least two courses from two different disciplines (6 or more credits)</p>
<p><b>Goal 7:</b> Choose one course from Century's goal 7 list. Make sure it is at least 3 credits.</p>	<p><b>Goal VII: Human Diversity in the U.S.</b> (3 or more credits)</p>
<p><b>Goal 8:</b> Choose one course from Century's goal 8 list. Make sure it is at least 3 credits.</p>	<p><b>Goal VIII: Global Perspective</b> (3 or more credits)</p>
