**Public Health and Medical Terminology are not prerequisite courses but they must be completed to graduate from the Mortuary Science program. It is recommended that students complete them before starting the program.

Application/Admission Information

- Students are admitted ONLY Fall Semester. The priority deadline for applications is February 1 each year. Applications are reviewed as received, and are accepted up to August 15, or until the Fall class has been filled, whichever is sooner.
- Applicants must have completed 60 semester credits with grades of A, B, C, or S prior to admission. **No** D grades will be accepted in prerequisites, liberal education courses, or degree courses.
- Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be considered for admission.
- Non-U of M students apply by submitting the Application for Transfer Admission to the University of Minnesota form either online at <http://admissions.tc.umn.edu/admissioninfo/trans.html>, or to the Office of Admissions in 240 Williamson (612-625-2008).
- All students are required to submit a professional statement and two letters of recommendation. Specific instructions and forms for these are available at <http://www.med.umn.edu/mortsci/admissions/application/index.htm>.
- Requests for waiver of a course requirement or a course evaluation should be directed to the Program office by contacting Molly Diethelm at 612-624-6464 or dieth007@umn.edu.
- Students seeking their first bachelor's degree are advised to complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MNTC) before transferring to the program. Students who do not complete the MNTC will need to complete the University of Minnesota's Liberal Education requirements.
