

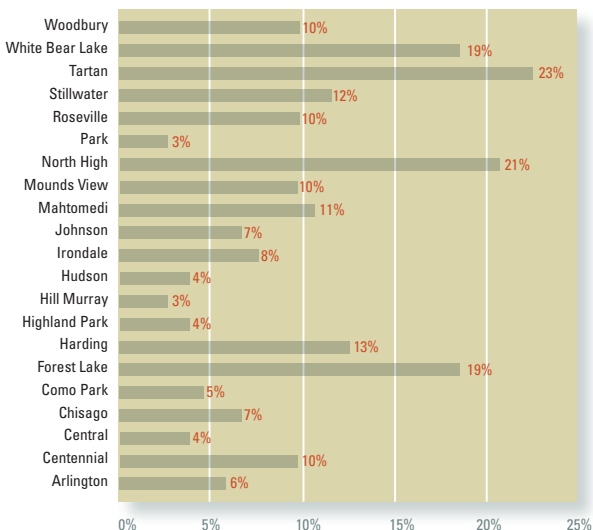
“FUTURES IN BLOOM”

- Remember these thoughts from Tom Gillaspay, Minnesota State Demographer:

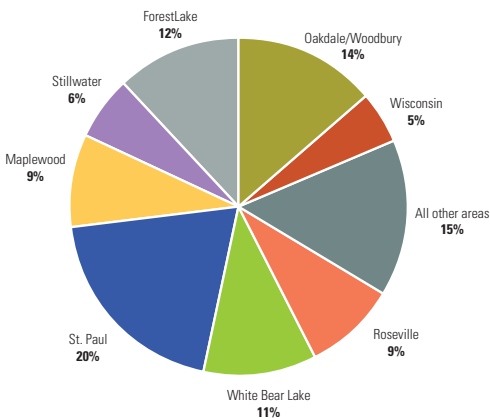
