Program Prerequisites:

1. Assessment score placement in MATH 0030 or completion of Math 0010 with a grade of C or higher; assessment score placement in ENGL 1021 or completion of ENGL 0090 with a grade of C or higher for those without prior higher education. Those individuals with prior higher education/college credits may be exempt with proof of course completion; official transcripts for all prior colleges must be sent to the college for exemption evaluations.
2. INTD 1020 Drafting for Interior Design and INTD 1040 Elements of Interior Design with a grade of C or higher are prerequisites for many Interior Design courses. Students should register for these 2 courses in the program as soon as possible. INTD 1040 is only offered in the **Fall Semester**. Please plan accordingly.

General Requirements:

1. Certificates: Up to 30 earned college-level credits. One third of credits must be earned at Century College.
Diplomas: 30 to 48 earned college-level credits. One third of credits must be earned at Century College.
AAS: At least 64 earned college-level credits (numbered 1000 or above). At least 20 credits must be earned at Century College.
2. Century college-level GPA of 2.0; Required career and occupational courses GPA of 2.0; MnTC GPA of 2.0.
3. A grade of C or higher in ENGL 1021 (for Diplomas and 30 credit Certificates ONLY IF this is the Goal 1 course selected.) (Exception: 16 credit certificates)
