



Associate Degree Programs at the College of St. Catherine: Transfer Guidelines for Century College

About the College of St. Catherine's Associate Degree Programs

The College of St. Catherine is a national leader in providing high quality associate degree programs and certificates in health care. Transferring Credit

Please review the attached Course Selection Guide to ensure you are choosing Century courses that will fulfill St. Catherine's associate degree requirements. **This course guide is intended only for students pursuing an associate's (2-year) degree:** Students planning to attend a baccalaureate (4-year) program at CSC will have different requirements, and a separate handout is available in the Century counseling center. CSC Admission counselors are more than happy to meet with you to evaluate your transcripts, explain how your courses meet CSC requirements, and make recommendations for registration at Century.

Previous college coursework must be at the college level (1000-level or higher) and a grade of C- or better must be earned. Pass grades are accepted. There is not a maximum number of credits that will transfer to St. Kate's; however, residency requirements will apply.

Applying to Associate Degree Programs

Applications to associate degree programs at St. Catherine are evaluated on a first-come, first-served basis beginning October 1st of the year prior to desired enrollment. A minimum 2.0 GPA is required. Students must submit an application, application fee, and official transcripts from each high school and university. ACT, SAT, or PSAT scores are not required for admission to associate degree programs.

Transfer Scholarships for Associate Degree Students

Scholarship for students who know a St. Catherine graduate, \$300. Referral card required with application.

DupliKate Scholarship, \$2000. Daughter or granddaughter of alum, annually renewable.

Family Scholarship, \$1000 per family member. Sister, mother, etc., renewable while attending simultaneously.

Students are not limited to one scholarship award, and many other sources of financial aid are available (scholarships, grants, loans, and student employment). Contact St. Catherine to find out how a private education can be affordable for you and to meet with a financial aid counselor.

- Courses must be at least 2 **semester** credits (3 quarter units) to satisfy a CSC requirement.
