

Metropolitan State University offers community college transfer students a unique opportunity for Bachelor of Science study in business fields.

THE METROPOLITAN STATE APPROACH FEATURES:

- Daytime, evening, on-line, and weekend courses
- Study with highly qualified faculty and working professionals from business and industry
- Upper-division study that builds on community college transfer credits
- A Business Online program that enables students to complete selected business majors entirely through online courses

GENERAL EDUCATION

- 40 semester credits of general education are required. See the Metropolitan State General Education Transfer Information sheet.
- Century's Associate of Arts (AA) degree or completed Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) fulfills MSU's 40-semester credit general education requirement. (Students will still need to complete eight credits of upper-division liberal studies courses.)
- "D" grades will transfer only for MnTC goal area courses. For other courses, only C- grades and above will transfer.
- Courses that apply to the major must be completed with a grade of C- or higher.

For College of Management majors, students should take the following **Foundation Courses** in the first two years along with the general education requirements:

- ACCT 2020+2025 (Both courses must be completed at Century to meet MSU requirement).
- ECON 1021 and 1023
- MATH 1040 or 1061, College Algebra (or any math course for which Math 1040 or 1061 is a prerequisite)
- MATH 1025 or ECON 2021
- CSCI 1020

THE FOLLOWING CENTURY COURSES WILL APPLY TO THE COLLEGE OF MANAGEMENT MAJORS LISTED ABOVE (Courses that apply to the major must be completed with a grade of C- or higher even if the A.A. is completed):

- ACCT 2020 **and** 2025 Financial Accounting and Managerial Accounting (together = Acct 210 at Metropolitan State).
- BMGT 2030 Management Fundamentals (not required for Economics major)
- BMGT 2055 Government Regulation of Business (required for Business Administration and Management Majors)
- CSCI 1020 Introduction to Microcomputers (Must be taken within 5 years of Admission to program at Metro State)
- ECON 1021 Macroeconomics
- ECON 1023 Microeconomics
- MATH 1025 Introductory Statistics **or** ECON 2021 Statistics for Business & Economics
- MATH 1040 or 1061 (F'06 or later) College Algebra or any MATH course for which College Algebra is a pre-requisite
- MATH 1081, Single Variable Calculus (required for Economics major only)
- MKTG 2050 Principles of Marketing (not required for Economics major)

Students completing a Century College A.A.S. in Marketing Communications Technologies or Visual Communications Technologies are eligible for admission to the Metropolitan State B.A.S degree in Visual Communications subject to completion of all of the Foundation courses for their major.

Effective fall, 2007, students must complete all of the Foundation courses for their major before being admitted to a College of Management B.S. or B.A.S major. See the College of Management web site below for the required Foundation courses for each major. Students may be admitted to Metropolitan State before completing the Foundation courses.
