Liberal Education requirements at the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum: The public higher education colleges and universities in Minnesota have developed a common liberal education curriculum, called the **Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC)**. Students who complete the MnTC at one of the participating schools and then transfer to the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities have fulfilled the University's first year writing requirement, as well as the liberal education requirements outlined below. The MnTC at Century requires 40 semester credits to be completed, which is now incorporated into the AA degree. However, you do not need to complete an AA degree to complete the MnTC. As part of the MnTC, the Council on Liberal Education at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities campus has established a common set of liberal education requirements for all students completing bachelor's degrees at the University. This guide shows which Century courses count towards liberal education requirements on the Twin Cities campus. **If you do not plan to complete the MnTC at Century, you should select your Century courses to fulfill the liberal education requirements according to the courses listed below.**

** NOTE: The prerequisite courses (Arch 1701 and Arch 1281) for admission to an architecture degree are ONLY offered on the U of M--Twin Cities campus. Students will begin in the pre-architecture program in the College of Design to complete these courses before applying to the architecture degree of their choice.*

GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL CDES DEGREES:

- Completion of ALL U of M High School Prep Requirements
- Required minimum GPA of 2.00 and preferred minimum GPA of 2.80
- Admission Supplement required for ALL CDes majors. Submit with admission application by deadline. Download supplement at http://design.umn.edu/prospective_students/admissions/transferadmit.html
- Admission materials MUST be submitted (postmarked) by the relevant deadline or the application will not be reviewed for admission. Materials required include:
 - Transfer Admission Application
 - CDes Admission Application Supplement
 - High school transcript(s) submitted (call U of M admissions to make sure it arrived here in time)
 - ALL college/university transcripts (call U of M admissions to make sure it arrived here in time)
 - Application Fee
- All programs are competitive and space is limited. Admission is holistic and based on a number of factors, including overall academic record, grades in specific courses, and supplement statement.

Architecture

THE COURSES IN THE ARCHITECTURE PROGRAMS ARE SEQUENCED OVER 3-4 YEARS, REGARDLESS OF COURSES COMPLETED BEFORE ADMISSION (if all generals are completed students register for a reduced load of credits consisting of specific studio courses). See design.umn.edu for sample four year plan. The prerequisite courses (Arch 1701 and Arch 1281) for admission to a full architecture degree are ONLY offered on the U of M—Twin Cities campus. Students who are admitted will begin in the pre-architecture program in the College of Design to complete these courses before applying to the architecture degree of their choice.

The following community college courses meet requirements in the degree but do not have to be completed prior to admission. Additional courses available only at the U of M are also required for graduation.

- Engl 1021 in lieu of Writ 1XXX—Freshman Writing (waived with AA or MNTC)
- Math 1070/1081 in lieu of Math 1142/1271—Short Calculus/Calculus
- Phys 1041 or 1081 in lieu of Phys 1101/1201/1301—Introduction to College Physics

Clothing Design

THE STUDIO COURSES IN THIS MAJOR ARE SEQUENCED OVER FOUR YEARS, REGARDLESS OF COURSES COMPLETED BEFORE ADMISSION TO THE U OF M (if all generals are completed students would register for a reduced load of credits consisting of specific studio courses). See design.umn.edu for sample four year plan. After admission students must pass portfolio review of work from specified studio courses, and meet minimum U of M GPA of 2.50 to move from Pre-Clothing Design to major status.

The following community college courses meet requirements in the major but do not have to be completed prior to admission. Additional courses available only at the U of M are also required for graduation.

- Engl 1021 in lieu of Writ 1XXX—Freshman Writing (waived with AA or MNTC)
- Comm 1021 in lieu of Comm 1101—Introduction to Public Speaking (waived with AA or MNTC)

Environmental Design

- Choose two of the following business courses: Acct 1010, Math 1025/Econ 2021

Graphic Design

THE STUDIO COURSES IN THIS MAJOR ARE SEQUENCED OVER FOUR YEARS, REGARDLESS OF COURSES COMPLETED BEFORE ADMISSION TO THE U OF M (if all generals are completed students would register for a reduced load of credits consisting of specific studio courses). See design.umn.edu for sample four year plan. After admission students pass portfolio review of work from year one studio courses and meet minimum U of M GPA of 2.50 to move from Pre-Graphic Design to major status.

The following community college courses meet requirements in the major but do not have to be completed prior to admission. Additional courses available only at the U of M are also required for graduation.

- Engl 1021 in lieu of Writ 1XXX—Freshman Writing (waived with AA or MNTC)
- Comm 1021 in lieu of Comm 1101—Introduction to Public Speaking (waived with AA or MNTC)

THE STUDIO COURSES IN THIS MAJOR ARE SEQUENCED OVER FOUR YEARS, REGARDLESS OF COURSES ALREADY COMPLETED BEFORE ADMISSION TO THE U OF M (if all generals are completed students would register for a reduced load of credits consisting of specific studio courses). See design.umn.edu for sample four year plan. After admission students pass portfolio review of work from specified studio courses and meet minimum U of M GPA of 2.50 to move from Pre-Interior Design to major status.

The following community college courses meet requirements in the major but do not have to be completed prior to admission. Additional courses available only at the U of M are also required for graduation.
