CENTURY COURSES THAT SATISFY PRE-CARLSON SCHOOL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

2. LOWER-DIVISION MAJOR REQUIREMENTS:

3. SECOND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

Students who graduated from high school after June 1986 will need to meet the University of Minnesota's second language requirement of **two years of high school or one college year of the same second language prior to transfer**. Persons for whom English is a second language are exempt from this requirement. See High School Preparation Requirement Guide. Students planning to major in International Business must complete 2 college years of a second language.

4. LIBERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS:

May be met by completing Century's Minnesota Transfer Curriculum or the current AA degree. Students completing a 1986 to 1994-95 version of the AA degree must complete the Designated Themes listed on U of M Liberal Arts Guide in the Century College Counseling Center, Room 2410.

ELECTIVES

Additional credits to total 60 semester credits -generally electives should be selected from the U of M Liberal Education Requirements Guide found in the Century Counseling Center. Contact the Office Of Admissions, for transferability of courses not listed on the U of M Liberal Education Guide.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS/INFORMATION:

Admission is very competitive and recent overall GPAs have been well over 3.5. Admission is based on a combination of the following criteria (no one criteria will automatically rule out an otherwise strong candidate):

1. Cumulative grade point average in all college coursework, rigor of curriculum and completion patterns.
2. Grade point average in "tool courses": accounting, economics, calculus and statistics. Most admitted students have greater than a 3.5 gpa in tool courses; students need to have 3 of the 5 tool courses completed by the time of application; the remaining two need to be in progress spring and/or summer term.
3. Strong leadership, service and/or work experience
4. Contents of the **application addendum**, which consists of **3 written essays** and a description of activities and accomplishments outside of the classroom. Students may download the Addendum from the Carlson School Website: www.carlsonschool.umn.edu/undergraduateadmissions

TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION you must have met the following requirements:

- ◆ Completion of 60 semester credits by the end of summer session for the following fall's admission.
- ◆ Completion of three management "tool" courses by the time you apply, and all five completed by the time you enroll in the fall. (See front for list)
- ◆ Completion of the pre-management requirements as listed on front.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: FALL SEMESTER – MARCH 1st

Carlson admits students for Fall semester only.

(Spring semester courses that are in progress will be considered for admission)

****Students planning on majoring in Accounting will need to take a pre-test prior to Taking Accounting 5101 at Carlson. This pre-test is not an admission requirement.**

Transfer students who are majoring in accounting are required to take and pass a pretest before taking 5101 at the U of M. This is a three hour exam covering fundamentals to solve accounting related business problems. A sample pretest is available for review from the Carlson School Undergraduate Studies Office. Students are strongly encouraged to review the sample pretest prior to the exam. It is recommended that you take the pre-test soon after completing financial accounting. The exam is available each semester. Telephone (612) 624-3313 to schedule the exam. There is no fee for this exam. If you don't pass the test, you may take Accounting 2050 at the U of M, but need an A or B in 2050 to go to 5101. Students are not allowed to retake Accounting 2050 if they don't earn an A or a B after failing the accounting pre-test. Pre-test scores are honored for a two year period after passing the exam.

NOTES:

- Carlson School of Management, at approximately 1650 students, is significantly smaller than Century.
- Vocational/Technical courses and courses numbered below 1000 do not transfer.
- All F's earned in transferable courses are calculated as zero grade points in the student's GPA.
- Students admitted for fall 2007 will be required to take a one credit Career Skills course the summer *before* they start the program.
