CENTURY COURSES THAT SATISFY MAJOR REQUIREMENTS:

There are no specific Century courses required for admission. While at Century, students should take classes that apply to the University of Minnesota Liberal Education requirements. Required for graduation are 36-40 journalism credits and 12 credits of upper level courses chosen in consultation with a faculty adviser after admission to the major.

*In addition to the Liberal Education and premajor requirements, students must satisfy the High School Preparation requirements. See the H. S. requirements sheet with the U of M transfer guides.

CENTURY COURSES THAT SATISFY LIBERAL EDUCATION AND SECOND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:

Refer to the Liberal Education guide of the College of Liberal Arts available in Century's Counseling Center for the Associate of Arts and Minnesota Transfer Curriculum transfer agreements (MnTC), Second Language requirement, and general transferability of courses.

NOTES: Transfer students will first apply to the College of Liberal Arts. To complete the major in a timely manner, students should plan to transfer as soon as they complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC), in order to complete the required semester at CLA prior to admission to the major (see below under admission requirements). Once a transferring student has been accepted by the College of Liberal Arts, an orientation/registration date will be assigned by the College in advance of the semester of entry. Before students register for classes, they will be referred to the School of Journalism and Mass Communication. Specific questions may be directed to:

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

The School admits about 350 undergraduate Professional and Mass Communication Track students annually. A student should apply after having completed:

- ◆ Preparatory course-Journalism 1001(or its transfer equivalent) with a grade of C or higher. This course may be in progress.
- ◆ 30 graded semester credits completed - including one semester (13 credits completed or in progress) with A, B, or C grade) in CLA at the University
- ◆ A "B" average is competitive.

Admission will be based on:

1. Overall GPA
2. Journalism 1001 grade
3. Recent GPA
4. Written statement of intent
