

The Program of Mortuary Science, under the administration of the U of M Medical School, offers a B.S. degree with a major in Mortuary Science. The program consists of two years of pre-professional coursework followed by two years in the professional program. To be considered for admission, students must complete: the U of M's high school preparation requirements, the Mortuary Science pre-professional requirements, 60 semester transferable credits, and have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50. Students are admitted to the professional program ONLY Fall Semester. Application submission by March 1 is strongly encouraged; applications are reviewed as received, and are accepted up to July 15, or until the Fall class has been filled, whichever is sooner.

LIBERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Students can complete Century's Associate in Arts degree, or the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) or the University of Minnesota Liberal Education requirements found on guide sheets in Century's Counseling Center.

Degree Requirements: Students must complete 120 credits to graduate, including at least 55 in the major. All courses must be completed with an A, B, C, or S grade. This includes all pre-professional, liberal education, and required mortuary science courses.

*To graduate with the BS degree with a major in Mortuary Science, students need to complete 60 upper division credits. If a student needs upper division credits in addition to the Mortuary Science coursework, the Personal and Community Health course (PubH 3001) that is offered at the U of M is upper division and can be taken along with the Mort Sci curriculum.
